



Alain ESTABLIER

Alain ESTABLIER is an experienced manager with an extensive background in large and medium – sized companies, as well as a recognized airport security civil expert. His accomplishments at ADP (Aéroports de Paris) have brought tremendous improvements in security management for Paris...

Pr. François GERE,

François GERE is a French historian specializing in geostrategy, is notably the founding president of the French strategic analysis institute, the Institut français d'analyse stratégique (IFAS). He is also an official representative for the French Institute of Higher National Defense Studies, the Institut des Hautes études de défense nationale (IHEDN) and research director at Paris III University. He was awarded the distinction of Knight of the French Legion of Honor in 2005.

In 1993, François GERE was technical advisor for nuclear affairs and official representative for arms control at the French national secretariat for national defense and security (Secrétariat général de la défense et de la sécurité nationale).

Senior researcher in 1994 at the Centre de Recherches et d'Études sur les Stratégies et les Technologies or Centre for Study of Strategies and Technologies (CREST) of the École Polytechnique in Palaiseau (France), in 1997 he became director of scientific affairs at the Foundation for Strategic Research, then in 2001 founded the Institut Diplomatie et Défense, which in 2003 became the Institut français d'analyse stratégique (IFAS), of which he is director. At the same time, he directed the Institut Diplomatie et Défense (2001–2004).



Lieutenant-General Rhett A. HERNANDEZ

Lieutenant-General Rhett A. HERNANDEZ was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant of Artillery from the United States Military Academy, West Point, New York on 2 June 1976.

His commands have ranged from the Battery level with 2nd Battalion, 33rd Field Artillery and 1st Battalion, 5th Field Artillery to Battalion level with 1st Battalion, 14th Field Artillery, later re-designated 3rd Battalion, 16th Field Artillery to Brigade level command as the Commander of Division Artillery, 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized), Fort Hood, Texas.

He also served as the Assistant Division Commander (Support), 1st Armored Division, United States Army Europe and Seventh Army, Germany and OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM, and the Commanding General, United States Army Human Resources Command, Alexandria, Virginia.

His current assignment is as the Commanding General, U.S. Army Cyber Command / Second Army at Fort Belvoir, Virginia.

Rear Admiral Arnaud COUSTILLIERE was born in Toulon in 1960 and promoted rear admiral since the 1th of July, he is appointing as "Cyberdefence General Officer" for French armed forces and Fr MoD, a new appointment just created in the Directorate of Joint Operations, but he was responsible of this domain since February 2011. He is an above warfare officer issued from the Naval Academy (1981-83). Between 1984 and 1999, he spent many times at sea and participated in many navy operations mainly in Indian Ocean and Mediterranean areas. He was Commanding Officer of four ships, the last one was the DDG DUQUESNE (2004-2006).



Dr Thomas RID

Dr Thomas RID is a Reader in War Studies at King's College London. He also is a non-resident fellow at the Center for Transatlantic Relations in the School for Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University, in Washington, DC.

In 2009/2010, Dr Thomas RID was a visiting scholar at the Hebrew University and the Shalem Center in Jerusalem. From 2006 to 2009, he worked at the Woodrow Wilson Center and the RAND Corporation in Washington, and at the Institut français des relations internationales in Paris. Dr Thomas RID wrote his first book and thesis at the Berlin-based Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik, Germany's major government-funded foreign policy think tank. Dr Thomas RID holds a PhD from the Humboldt Universität zu Berlin.

Stanislas de MAUPEOU is responsible for Cyber Defense activities at the electronic systems company Thales. He was formerly head of the French government computer emergency response team, part of the defense and national security secretariat (SGDSN), and a marine infantry officer.
